Linn County Blues Society has retained a new webmaster. Mr. John Shultz. He'll be taking over the design and administration of the LCBS web site, www.lcbs.org. Many of you will recognize John as one of our local musicians. He plays keyboards with The Beaker Brothers, The John Shultz Organization, The John Shultz Trio, Big and Easy, and The Saints Dixieland Band. In his nonmusical life, John is immersed in web applications.

One of the first things John will be working on is improving the LCBS calendar of events. The LCBS calendar is available in 3 forms; (1) printed in the monthly BluesPaper, which is mailed to our members, distributed free through local outlets, and available free from the web as a download at www.lcbs.org, (2) sent in our weekly BluesBlast e-mail to our members, and (3) viewable on our web page at www.lcbs.org.

Lacy Gibson 1936-2011

Alligator Records

amed Chicago bluesman Lacy Gibson died on April 11, 2011 as a result of a heart attack. Known for his sophisticated, jazz-influenced guitar style and robust vocals, Gibson was a musician's musician. His rich, flashy guitar style was featured in dozens of bands, including those of Son Seals, Otis Rush, Willie Dixon, Jimmy Reed, Billy "The Kid" Emerson, Billy Boy Arnold, Sun Ra and many others.



Born on May 1, 1936 in Salisbury, North Carolina, Gibson headed to Chicago with his family in 1949. He gravitated to the city's blues scene, where he met Willie Dixon, Matt "Guitar" Murphy, Sunnyland Slim and Muddy Waters, learning directly from the masters. By the mid-1960s, Gibson was an in-demand session player for local labels, including Chess, where he worked with Buddy Guy and sang My Love Is Real with Buddy on guitar. He cut two 45s for the tiny Repetto label in 1968, one of which also features Guy on guitar. His first LP, Wishing Ring, was released on his brother-in-law Sun Ra's El Saturn label in 1971.

Survivors include his wife, Ann Gibson, son Erte Lacy Shaffer, daughters Coronto Shaffer, Synphia Shaffer, Verdonna Shaffer, B.B. Gibson, Tamika Gibson, 17 grandchildren and six greatgrandchildren.

The Blue Band is rapidly approaching their 30th Anniversary June 10, 2011. During the evening, front man Bob Dorr announced that he is the second youngest in the current lineup, and that the band formed shortly after Iowa became a state!

The Campbell Steele Gallery is a unique venue for an evening listening to The Blue Band's original and cover blues, soul, rockabilly, and rhythm and blues grooves. The gallery often hosts live music in their Music in the MUD series, with several more events scheduled this spring and fall. You can find their calendar of events at campbellsteele.com. The evening in the gallery was enhanced by their art as well as a selection of wines, beers, and cheese plates. Very uptown for a blues gig.

Al Naylor performed a solo on the duck call, and demonstrated some original choreography for the band. Heath Alan Pattschull drove over from Des Moines to treat us with his tasty saxophone licks. One of the evening's highlights was Bob Dorr performing an extended harp solo with his wireless pickup while walking and dancing with the crowd in the entire gallery. Bob was seen dancing with several of the local shop owners that evening. The members of the Blue Band this evening were, Heath Alan Pattschull: Sax, Al Naylor: Trumpet (and duck call), Steve Hayes: Drums, Bob Dorr: vocals and harp, Mark Linda: Bass, and Jeff Petersen: Guitar-Also, Ralph Stephens sat in Washboard.

The term "the blues" refers to the "blue devils", meaning melancholy and sadness; an early use of the term in this sense is found in George Colman's one-act farce Blue Devils (1798). Though the use of the phrase in African-American music may be older, it has been attested to since 1912, when Hart Wand's "Dallas Blues" became the first copyrighted blues composition. In lyrics the phrase is often used to describe a depressed mood.


