




Vusi Mahlasela at CSPS "The Voice"

o distinctive is South African's Vusi Mahlasela, he is known in his country simply as "The Voice," Vusi unites South African folk rhythms with a global palette of pop, blues and soul.

His expressive singing has made him a vocal advocate for social justice since his youth when he was involved in the struggle against Apartheid. This struggle was captured in the documentary Amandla! A Revolution in Four-Part Harmony, which introduced the world to this extraordinary force for beauty and hope.

After the release of Amandla! A Revolution in Four-Part Harmony, and the accompanying soundtrack, long-time admirer and fellow South African, Dave Matthews, signed Vusi to his own ATO Records label and released The Voice (2003), a collection of the best songs from Vusi's catalog. In 2007, ATO released Guiding Star, his first full-length release in the States. The new album, produced by Taj Mahal and recorded at Dave Matthews Band's studio in Charlottesville, VA, captures Vusi's hope for the future of Africa: "Let all those who share in Mandela's greatest wish--to one day see an Africa that is at peace with herself-SAY AFRICA."

Finis Tasby suffers stroke Delta Groove artist needs your help!

elta Groove would like to share with our family that The Mannish Boys lead vocalist and founding member Finis Tasby suffered a severe stroke that has left him with what we hope is only temporary paralysis. Finis does have Medicare but has absolutely no other funds. We are praying for his eventual recovery but it will be a long tedious process. At this time he is at The Antelope Valley Hospital in Lancaster California. Finis has not been able to eat and cannot move the left side of his body, speech is very limited, and he has undergone surgery to place a feeding tube in his stomach. ABOUT FINIS TASBY:

Powerhouse vocalist Finis Tasby was born in Dallas, Texas in 1940, and grew up immersed in the vibrant Texas blues tradition. As a teenager got his first professional music experience as drummer with the local combo The Blues Blasters. By the early 1960s he'd switched instruments, and was playing bass and singing backup with local legends

The Thunderbirds, working regularly with Z.Z. Hill, and backing Clarence Carter, Lowell Fulson, and Freddie King on regional tours. By the mid '60s Finis had stepped out in front of the band, and began establishing his reputation as one of the most soulful R&B and blues singers on the circuit.

In the early '70s Finis relocated to Los Angeles, and soon picked up where he'd left off in Texas. As a bass player, he worked with many big names, including B.B. King, Percy Mayfield and Big Mama Thornton. But it is as a vocalist that Finis really came into his own, making his recording debut as a frontman in the 1970s. It was during this period that he also formed a lifelong friendship with blues great John Lee Hooker, with whom he often performed locally. Finis' reputation as a strong and soulful singer reached new heights with the releases of a series of releases, including "People Don't Care" on Shanachie, from which three songs were used in the film "The Babysitter"

In the late 1990s Finis began his alliance with Rand Chortkoff, when Rand independently produced Finis' CD "Jump Children", which was released to wide acclaim on the Evidence label. Finis and Rand have worked closely ever since, with Finis a charter member of The Mannish Boys, Chortkoff's 'all-star' project at the core of Delta Groove Productions. Together, Rand and Finis have collaborated on numerous recording projects and live performances around the world over the last two decades."

Pianoland Blind Pig Records

Deanna Bogart's newest offering is entitled Pianoland, which is very appropriate. It is like walking around Austin or New Orleans; different piano music coming at you from everywhere. There is of course a lot of boogie-woogie style but also jazz, country-swing and blues.

All of this crossbreeding could sound out of place in lesser hands but Deanna has played all of these styles playing piano and sax. She has been the piano player in a western-swing band played in blues bands and has lead her own group for several years. She was a crowd favorite in 20010 at Bluesmore.

The problem people have is trying to package her. Is she jazz, swing, rock or as she is usually identified; blues? I like to think of her as a funky bluesy Norah Jones. She is blessed with a soulful voice, which gives everything on the CD that feel.

She is also a good songwriter; check out; "Couldn't Love You More", or the first song on the disc; "In The Rain". But it is her ability to move from soul filled blues to jazz to up beat country— swing that makes this a very good listen.

She covers a Willy Dixon blues and a Pete Johnson boogie — something you would expect from her. She then does "Somewhere Over the Rainbow" as a blues song. She accents the sadness and longing in the song making it something totally new.

This is the disc to play for friends that say all blues sounds the same. This is blues music no doubt but also genre crossing music with broad appeal.
