

Walk & Dorrin Class of 2005 for Iowa Blues Hall of Fame

The Class of 2005 Iowa Blues Hall of Fame inductees have finally been announced! Both Fred Walk and Bob Dorr, nominees very familiar to the Linn County Blues scene, have been selected.

Fred Walk, of course, is the original guitarist for the famed Linn County band. Bob Dorr is the leader of The Blue Band as well as the long time DJ's voice of KUNI radio.

Also in this year's class are Steve George, singer with the Bob Pace Band, and Blues vocalist Joanne Jackson.

The induction ceremonies for the Class of 2005 will be Sunday, April 30, 2006 at Blues On Grand in Des Moines, the home of IBHOF. The doors will open at 3 PM and the festivities will kick off at 4 PM with live music by Chicago Rick's Iowa Blues Hall of Fame Revue, featuring IBHOF members George Davis, Gilbert Davis, and Harlan "Soul Man" Thomas.

The four inductees will be honored and will also perform with the band, followed by an All-Star Jam until 10 PM. The cover for this fantastic event will be \$10, which will include a full dinner provided by Jesse James of JJ Catering. A portion of the door proceeds will go to the new inductees.

To be eligible for the IBHOF, the person must have been performing music professionally 30 years or more prior to the induction date. They must be, or have been, rooted in a Blues genre. they must also have been born in Iowa or have held residence in the state at one time. Each nominating committee must provide proof or documentation of eligibility, along with bios, photographs and music samples of the Blues Hall of Fame nominees.

Cedar Rapids is in the Northeast region which includes Marion, Waterloo, Cedar Falls, Iowa City, Coralville and Mason City.

Blues 'n' Buffett Chili Challenge raises \$5,159!!!

We did it!!! The Linn County Blues Society (LCBS) and the Isle of Iowa Parrot Head Club (IIPHC) raised \$5,159 at their Sixth Annual Blues 'n' Buffett Chili Challenge held on Sunday, February 26, at the Best Westem Longbranch Hotel and Convention Center. That's almost \$1,100 more than last year!

The Chili Challenge is a friendly competition between the two clubs to raise money for charity. All proceeds were presented to the H.D. Youth Center and The Boys and Girls Club of Cedar Rapids.

As first time winners of the People's Choice voting, LCBS presented a check for \$2,631.09 to Henry Davison of the H.D. Youth Center. Amy Tucker of the Boys and Girls Club accepted a check of \$2,527.91 from the Parrot Heads.

Twenty-eight members of the two clubs prepared their favorite chili recipes to share with the public. In addition to raising money for charity, the challengers competed for numerous prizes awarded to the clubs and to individuals.





Alligator Records New Releases

Alligator Records celebrates 35th Anniversary with double release



Alligator Records, the country's largest contemporary Blues label, is celebrating its 35th anniversary with two releases hitting the street on April 4. The first is a one-of-a-kind 2-CD set: "Alligator Records 35 X 35 —35 songs, 35 years of Genuine House-rockin' Music," in which Alligator president Bruce Iglauer and staff look back, in chronological order, at highlights from artists' debut releases for the label.

"35 X 35" is not just another best-of compilation. It spotlights songs from the Alligator debut release from each featured artist on the very first Alligator album, (1971's Hound Dog Taylor and the Houserockers) to the legendary Mavis Staples' chilling "A Dying Man's Plea."

From the searing hard Blues of Hound Dog Taylor, Son Seals, Albert Collins, Luther Allison, Koko Taylor and Buddy Guy, to harmonica-driven workouts from Big Walter Horton, Carey Bell, James Cotton, Charlie Musselwhite and William Clarke to the Gulf Coast piano Blues of Professor Longhair, Katie Webster and Marcia Ball

to the acoustic music of Saffire—The Uppity Blues Women and Corey Harris.

With personal notes on each track from Iglauer in the accompanying 40-page booklet, "35 X 35" is proof of the staunchly independent label's single-minded vision for all these years: to record nothing but deeply rooted "Genuine Houserockin' Music."



California-bred, New Orleans-schooled singer/songwriter/vocalist Eric Lindell is a roots rocker with dozens of original songs that combine soul-shaking rhythm & Blues, reggae grooves and Louisiana swamp pop.

He has been featured on the cover of *Offbeat* magazine and performed on the main stage at the New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival in 2003, and will be playing the main stage again this year.

The winner of the 1999 John Lennon Songwriting Competition, Lindell is now ready to bring his rough-hewn voice and memorable original songs to the rest of the

music-loving world with the release of his Alligator Records debut.

Eric Lindell's "Change In the Weather," looks forward—an album whose completely original, rootsy, funky music and hook-filled, cliche-free songs will launch Lindell into the musical mainstream.

Janey's Heal the Night brings it back home

Bryce Janey's latest CD release, Heal the Night, is clearly heavily influenced by his writing, performing, and living "back home" in Linn County. Songs like "1973" and "Chance with Me" could well be Janey reflecting back to his roots.

The set kicks off with a good ol' time rocker, "Sweet Lovin' You," setting the pace for ten originals from Janey. Next up, highlighted by the steady back beat of DJ Johnson on bass and Steve Hayes on drums, come "Love in New York City." The title track, "Heal the Night," is one of two acoustic Blues tunes showcasing the down home "Delta Blues" influence of Janey. The other, "Need Your Love," closes out the disc.

Mixing things up by spotlighting the band members, "Come Sit By the Fire" features Hayes on drums, Gary King on sax and Sam Salomone on Hammond B-3. This "feel good" tune happens to be my personal favorite.

This is to date my favorite Bryce Janey CD. Heal the Night has a taste of everything from Blues ballads to butt-rockers and a bit of what's in between. This CD is now available at local Barnes & Noble, CD Warehouse, Music Go Round, The Music Loft, and on Bryce's website at www.thejaneys.com


