he 18th Annual Chili Challenge will be held on Sunday, February 11 from 1:00 to 4:00 PM at the Collins Road Marriot.

So far this event has raised over \$104,000 for two charities:
The Henry Davison Youth Center and the Free Medical
Clinic. Each year, the revenue divided between these two local charities has grown and this year looks to be no exception.

The LCBS is again well represented by a long list of veteran contestants. They are Ruby Andrews and Kimmy Galloway, Bob Erger and Deb Neyens, Matt Heck and Dave Antin, Rich Lyle, Allene Pease and Robin Level, Ben Sanders and a group of youth from the Henry Davison Youth Center lead by Ishmael Tureaud. These participants have represented the LCBS proudly in the past and are looking to take all honors again this year.

In addition, Dan 'DJ' Johnson, 2007 Iowa Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and 2016 Iowa Blues Hall of fame recipient will be a judge for the 4th year. He will be joined on the judging platform by Iowa Blues Challenge winner, Kevin B.F. Burt. Rumor has it that DJ and Kevin may be doing some acoustic blues after the judging is complete and the votes are being counted.

Alligator Records 2018

Winning Hand

Tinsley Ellis returns to Alligator Records with a new album, Winning Hand. The Chicago Tribune said in a recent review, "Ellis torches with molten fretwork...combining with his melodic riffs and rousing, intense solos." These skills have defined his playing for the 30 years he has been playing, but he keeps refining these and adding new elements to his songs.

He discovered the blues through the back door of British Invasion bands like The Yardbirds, The Animals, Cream and The Rolling Stones as well as Southern rockers like The Allman Brothers. Elements of British blues and southern rock are still very present in his playing.

He is joined on this recording by many members of his long time band. Kevin McKendree on keyboards, Steve Mackey bass and Lynn Williams on drums. McKendree also produced the recording with Ellis. The addition of McKendree's keyboards, that have been prominently displayed on the last few discs, have offered a much richer sound to the band

He is one of the hardest working and most well travelled of the modern bluesmen, he is proud of being on the road all of the time. "A musician never got famous staying home," he says. He was featured at the LCBS's 2015 blues show and has been at CSPS several times, catch him live.

Recorded in Nashville and produced by Ellis and Kevin McKendree, the ten songs include nine originals, ranging from southern blues, fiery blues/rock solos to soulful ballads. He is a great vocalist, which is easy to forget with his outstanding guitar playing. On his only cover song, Ellis pays tribute to one of his greatest guitar playing and songwriting influences, with a Freddie King-inspired version of Leon Russell's "Dixie Lullaby."

This is a great record from an artist that seems to get better with every recording.

The "Last Goodbye Tour"

The Blue Band wrapping it up at Riverside Casino

aturday, January 13th, Bob Dorr and the Blue Band performed their "Last Goodbye" show at Riverside Casino. Following a couple of terrific sets from the wonderful Duke Tumatoe, who captivated the crowd with "Give Me Back My Wig", "You Don't Drink Enough" and "Tie You Up", Bob Door and the Blue Band tore through three exhilarating sets of music to the largest audience I have ever seen at the Show Lounge.

Bob Dorr kicked the first set off with the swinging "Don't Sting, Bite or Bug Me" which was followed by slough of sweet tunes of which included "3 AM Backdoor Baby" and "Bottle in the Kitchen". To commemorate Bob's sixty-sixth birthday which fell on January 12, the band played "Happy Birthday Blues" before working their way down the set list to hammer out splendid covers of Sam and Dave's, "Soul Man", and Van Morrison's, "Domino".

The second set broke open with a fabulous jam on "Not Fade Away". Cathy Henry gave a captivating performance singing Etta James's, "Blues is My Business". One of the biggest highlights for me was hearing "Elvis in Paraguay". It was fabulous. Ralph Stephens joined in on washboard and Bob broke out the zydeco tie for a rousing jamboree on "They All Asked For You", which melted quite nicely into a medley of "Iko Iko" and "Jambalya". The set closed out with a riveting delivery of "Mustang Sally". It was an instant crowd pleaser.







Set number three included fun songs like "Drugs Drugs Drugs" and the high energy horn-heavy ska tune "Arc Welded". It was absolutely wonderful. Also included in this final set was "Nadine", which was immediately followed by "The Last Goodbye". The performance was outstanding.

Bob Dorr and the Blue Band kept the electricity going through the night, winding down with "Bobby's Blues", and landing on "Mojo and the Say So" for a grand ending. For the encore, they returned to play "Any Ordinary Man", which brought the show to its final close. It was a magical evening indeed.

Kevin Burt wins BIG!

The 34th International Blues Challenge

owa City blues musician Kevin B.F. Burt was the winner of the Solo/Duo competition at the 34th International Blues Challenge (IBC), presented by the Blues Foundation, on Saturday evening. In addition, he won the Lee Oskar Best Harmonica award and the Cigar Box Guitar award for Most Promising Acoustic Act. Kevin was among 235 bands & solo/duo acts from around the world entered into the 5 day event on Beale Street, which in addition to the IBC competition, also features an International Showcase, a Youth Showcase and the annual Keeping the Blues Alive awards.

Kevin got the opportunity to participate in the IBC by virtue of winning the Iowa Blues Challenge (IABC) Solo/Duo competition in September, presented by the Central Iowa Blues Society in Des Moines and co-sponsored by the Mississippi Valley Blues Society in Davenport, the South Skunk Blues Society in Newton and the Southeast Iowa Blues Society in Fairfield. (In 2018 the Linn County Blues Society in Cedar Rapids will also be an IABC co-sponsor).

This was Kevin's 2nd opportunity to participate in the IBC. In 1995, he and his band the Blues Instigators represented the Central Iowa Blues Society at what was known then as the International Blues Talent Competition.

Videos of Kevin's preliminary round performances on Wednesday & Thursday nights at Lew's Blue Note Bar & Grill, his semi-finals performance on Friday at Peoples on Beale and his finals performance on Saturday at the Orpheum Theatre can be seen on the Central Iowa Blues Society's Facebook page: www.facebook.com/centraliowabluessociety.

The Iowa entry in the Band category, the Avey Grouws Band, with Jeni Grouws from Decorah & Chris Avey, Bryan West, Randy Leasman & Andrew Durham from the Quad Cities, advanced to the semi-finals before being eliminated. The Redwoods, a youth act from Omaha/Council Bluffs was sponsored by CIBS in the Youth Showcase.
