As I'm sure you are aware, the building that housed the HD Youth Center has been sold and the proceeds are being used to support students in Linn County via educational scholarships. The Board is now finalizing the scholarship application forms, the actual application process and working very hard to make this process objective with equal opportunity to all, which is exactly how Henry would have insisted the process work. Bob Randklev and his company Cyberinnovation has been a great help setting up the web and the electronic transactions that make this possible.

The plan is to open applications on December 1 and award 5 scholarships of \$4,000 each. I will keep you posted on our progress. Board Chair Steve Springer.

Taste over 20 chili recipes which includes at least 6 professional entries along with another great silent auction. There will be celebrity judges, including local television and radio personalities who will taste and vote on the Overall Best Chili as well as Best Chili in one of four categories. Well, I have finally reached the point in my musical career (if I may call it a career) where I have made my own Tip Jar. I intend to bring it to a Sunday afternoon performance that a local municipality is sponsoring. As I readied myself and my equipment for the upcoming gig, going through the list that I keep in my head, I suddenly thought, "Tip Jar" and added it to the items.

I had a suitable clear plastic container and I took one of our band's cards and wrote "Tips" on its back and taped it inside the jar. Over the years I have noted a de facto standard for tips jars and I felt that my creation certainly had the right look.

For quite some time our band did not put a Tip Jar on stage with us, even if the venue offered one. I felt that the act of begging (albeit passive) was not appropriate. Street musicians play exclusively for tips, but we were a band - playing a gig. Heck, sometimes we even had a written contract. Without giving it much critical thought, I reasoned that there were some types of performances where, no matter how good the music or how much a listener is moved, tipping is not done. For example, church musicians are not tipped, nor are classical orchestras, nor big name performers. Our band does not fall into any of these categories but I still resisted putting out the jar. Maybe I was just fearful that it would be empty (or nearly so) at the end of the night.

It was the well-meaning folks at the smaller venues that we were playing who began to erode my resolve to keep the Tip Jar from the band's performance space. A club where the band is face-to-face with the audience is a setting where tips are more likely to be proffered, and as we were setting up at these smaller venues, one of the fine people who would later be serving food and drink would haul out the Jar and offer it. At first, I would still put it aside and keep it hidden. I treated it like some piece of good advice that my mother may have given me about my blues playing technique. It may have been a good idea but I couldn't get past some notion that I was too "cool" to accept it.

Then I happened to view a rerun of a clip of John Lee Hooker playing on Maxwell Street in Chicago. As I watched, I saw it... there it was, at his side, out in front – the Tip Jar. One of the most authentic and iconic (and certainly "cool") bluesmen ever, was laying it down for tips. And then I began to understand...

He wasn't begging. Not in the least. His Tip Jar was being utilized as an age-old method of connecting to the audience. The small offerings (often accompanied by a request for a song) were the original "like" button. The contributions were similar to commenting an approval on social media. John Lee's Tip Jar was a further



way for the audience to be a part of the performance. And there is nothing more American than showing love and approval by offering money (think grandparents, tooth fairy, money for good grades, etc.).

My eyes had been opened. I began to see. The small offering placed in the Tip Jar provides a means for the audience to engage more closely in the musical performance, and to get a chance to maybe call the tune in the bargain.

Now I have learned to do my part when playing by putting out the Tip Jar. And when I go see live music, I put an extra couple of \$5s or \$10s in my pocket so that I am ready to express my love and approval.

Biscuit Miller and the Mix "Chicken Grease" 2019 – American Showplace

Chicken Grease, the latest release from Biscuit Miller and the Mix is absolutely fabulous. Miller, who took home the Blues Music Award for Bass Player of the Year in 2012 and 2017, fronts a tight band steeped in Chicago blues. Their music is smothered in grease and fortified with funk. The Mix consists of Doctor Love on drums, Bobby B. Wilson on guitar, Alex 'Southside' Smith on guitar, and John Ginty on Hammond B3, Vintage Vibe electric piano, and percussion.

The funky groove of "Here Kitty Kitty" pulls me right in with its playful energy. This one always puts a grin on my face. "Two Legged Dog" keeps the funk flowing with a righteously contagious riff, and killer beat. With lap-steel in hand, Marcus Randolph makes a couple of outstanding appearances: the first on "609", and the second on title-track "Chicken Grease". Both are superb tracks, and Randolph sounds amazing.


Biscuit's smooth-as-silk vocals are front and center as he suavely slows it down with the soulful "Watching You". "Get Ready", a song of peace and love, sweetly brings the album to a close with brilliant keys and a hot buttery baseline.

Chicken Grease is a must hear for blues and soul music aficionados. It's such an enjoyable listen from beginning to end.

Teresa James & The Rhythm Tramps Jesi-lu Records (10/25/19 Release date) "Live!"

"Live!" is the eleventh release by Teresa James & The Rhythm Tramps. It was recorded live at Bogie's, over four different nights with four different lineups. The disc contains thirteen tracks that include seven originals and six covers of some of Teresa's favorite songs. Many of these tracks are from some of the band's earlier releases of which one - "Here In Bablyon" - garnered a Grammy Award nomination, and another - "Bottom Line" - earned Teresa a nod for "Contemporary Female Blues Artist of the Year" at the 2008 Blues Music Awards. Not only did I have the pleasure of reviewing that CD but It was at those awards where I also had the pleasure of meeting Teresa for the very first time.

The players responsible for the wonderful music on "Live!" are: Teresa James on lead vocals and keyboards; Terry Wilson on bass and background vocals; Billy Watts on guitar, background and lead vocals; Herman Matthews, Jay Bellarose, and Tony Braunagel on drums; Lee Thornburg and Darrell Leonard on trumpet; and Joe Sublett, Paulie Cerra and Ron Dziubla on saxophone.

The story Teresa's telling on the opening and original track could very well be told by many of us blues fans, as well. As she tells it, since she found the blues, she's been "In The Pink". As a matter of fact, it took all of the track's first five seconds to put me in the pink. The funky horns of Lee and Ron; the smoking rhythm of Terry and Herman; and Teresa's boogie piano playing; immediately had me dancing in my chair and there was no looking back from there. Teresa started belting out the names of those who helped her find these blues; the horn and piano highlights became powerful solos and things just kept getting pinker.


The next track - "I Like It Like That" (L. Pauling) - could not have been more of a perfect segue. Musically, it's another one for the movers and the shakers, and it features Teresa showcasing those sassy vocals of hers. At tracks end, it's obvious the crowd liked it like that.

Back in February of 2008, while reviewing the bands "Bottom Line" CD, these are the exact words I used to describe the next original song: "As Teresa begs '(Please) Put The Squeeze On Me", she does it in such a soulful and sultry way it made me wish it was me she was asking"...and nothing has changed. I'm sure it's throw back fifties style presentation makes it a favorite for the slow dancers.

Another of the original songs is one called "She Has A Way With Men". With that in mind, it's Teresa's plan to make sure she's not getting a way with her man. Not that that would ever happen, right Terry? Great old school soul sound with Lee and Paulie leading the way on the horns and Jay joining Terry for the hard driving rhythm.

On this duet, not only does the track come from Etta's songbook but on their rendition of "If I Can't Have You" (H. Fuqua/E. James), Teresa James and Billy Watts seem to have nailed the song in a way that Etta and Dr. John did on some of their many duo performances. That, along with some low down blues piano and guitar leads from them as well, easily make this one of the disc's best.

The last of the originals is titled "The Day The Blues Came To Call". It's a song off of the bands Grammy nominated release titled "Here In Babylon" - and as far as I'm concerned the song should have garnered a "Song of The Year" nod as well. Vocally, musically, lyrically and delivery wise, the blues just don't get any better than this.



Other tracks on "Live!" - which is pretty much a "best of" Teresa James & The Rhythm Tramps release - include: "Easier Said Than Done;" "Forgetting You;" "Don't Make A Habit Of This" (all originals); "Shoorah Shoorah" (A. Toussaint); "Everyday Will Be like A Holiday" (W. Bell/B. Jones); "I Want It All" (G. Clark. B. Swan); and "Long Way From Texas" (T. Klemperer).
